Making all things New: We thank the parishioners who attended the 1st Open Meeting and remind you of the importance of completing and returning your Demographics sheets and Parish Surveys to Fr Joe in time for collection (early July). It is vital that as many parishioners as possible participate in this initiative. The current rules for Fasting before receiving Holy Communion: The current rules were introduced by Pope Paul VI on November 21, 1964, and are found in Canon 919 of the Code of Canon Law:

- A person who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before holy communion from any food and drink, except for only water and medicine.
- A priest who celebrates the Most Holy Eucharist two or three times on the same day can take something before the second or third celebration even if there is less than one hour between them.
- The elderly, the infirm, and those who care for them can receive the Most Holy Eucharist even if they have eaten something within the preceding hour.

The Ego Self or the Noble Self: To serve this Idol you have to agree to never make others feel uncomfortable. The drug of approval in all forms including Social Medias virtual approval makes us avoid being ourselves and for the sake of 'fitting in' we sacrifice our own individuality.
